Cubs

Entering grade 2. Children entering grade 1 may register if they have an older sibling in the program.

Program emphasizes games, swimming, old rock 'n roll music, and sharing.

Campers

Program emphasizes active games, sports, math, old rock 'n roll music, and courtesy.

Senior Campers

Entering grades 8, 9, & 10

Program emphasizes sports, math, courtesy, and helpfulness. Campers entering 10th grade may attend for half price.

Morning Arrival: Drop your child off in front of Farley Field House each morning between 7:00 a.m. & 9:00 a.m. Your child will be checked in for the day in the lobby. You may bring your child to camp later if you want, but organized activities begin each day at 9:00 a.m.

What to Bring: Each day a camper should wear sneakers, shorts, and a t-shirt, and bring a lunch, a swim suit, and a towel. There is no need to bring anything else. We supply all other equipment including tennis balls and tennis rackets. Expensive sports equipment should not be brought to camp. Please write your child's name on all clothing (particularly hats, towels, swim suits & sweatshirts).

We do not allow: iPods, radios, headphones, skateboards, cards, or gum at camp. Cell phones are discouraged. Campers should not bring money or other valuables.

Afternoon Pick-up: You may pick up your child any time before 6:00 p.m. Organized activities end at 4:00 p.m. each day. There will be supervised free time in the field house from 4:00 p.m. - 5:30 p.m. and daily clean-up from 5:30 p.m. - 6:00 p.m.

Late Pick-up Charge: Because we have generous hours and we are not set up to keep staff on duty after 6:00 p.m. there is a steep charge for late pick up of children. The penalty fee is \$5 for the first 1-10 minutes, \$10 for 11-20 minutes, \$15 for 21-30, etc. **Time is determined by the clock in the lobby.**

SPORTS

We will play soccer, tennis, floor hockey, and other sports for fun, teamwork, and leadership. There will be some informal instruction as it pertains to the flow of the game, but nothing that would compare to what a soccer or tennis camp would try to accomplish. Wiffle ball, dodge ball, and kick ball are very popular.

SWIMMING

Each day will include 30 minutes of informal instruction by the camp counselors, and 30 minutes of free swim. The goals of day camp lessons are to teach beginners how to swim, and to make other campers better and safer swimmers. We will not offer any courses from the Red Cross swim program. We encourage all campers to go into the pool, but reluctant swimmers can stay out and play field games.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

We also practice math, play board games, sing rock 'n roll songs, memorize poems, and do arts & crafts projects such as knitting and painting.

Release and Indemnity Agreement

In consideration of Bowdoin College (the "College") accepting the Participant into the Bowdoin College Day Camp Summer Program ("the Summer Program"), the undersigned agrees as follows:

1. The undersigned understands that the Participant's involvement in the Summer Program at the College poses risks of personal injury, loss or damage to property, or loss of life. The undersigned knowingly assumes any and all risks connected with Participant's involvement in the Summer Program and hereby waives any right to make any claim against the College, its officers, employees, Trustees, or agents.

2. The undersigned, on behalf of himself/herself and the Participant, hereby releases the College, its employees, and agents from any claim. The undersigned further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the College, its officers, employees, Trustees, or agents from any such claim.

3. This indemnity, waiver and release includes, without limitation, any claim arising out of negligence or alleged negligence on the part of the College, its officers, employees, Trustees, or agents.

4. For purposes of this Agreement, the term "claim" means any claim, cause of action, damage or liability, specifically including attorney's fees, relating to or in connection with the Participant's involvement in the Summer Program.

5. This Agreement shall be governed by Maine law and shall be binding on the heirs, personal representatives and assigns of the undersigned. If any part of this Agreement is found to be unenforceable by a court or other body having jurisdiction, the provisions shall be altered and not eliminated as may be considered reasonable, and as amended shall be enforced.

6. As a condition of, and in consideration of, the acceptance of this application, therefore, the undersigned parent/guardian consents to have administrators of the Summer Program act in his/her behalf should an emergency arise, and hereby grants permission to said administrators to authorize medical attention and treatment. The consenting guardian or parent understands that any medical treatment is not payable by the College.

7. The undersigned understands that it is a requirement of the Summer Program that all Participants be covered by health insurance.
