

Executive Assistance Program for Bowdoin Students and Faculty Traveling Abroad

Bowdoin College students and faculty have access to the Executive Assistance Program when they are traveling outside the United States.

Listed below are examples of services you may require for which you should call the Executive Assistance Program.

You should call the Executive Assistance Service when:

- You require a referral to a hospital or doctor.
- You are hospitalized.
- You may need to be evacuated or repatriated.
- You need to guarantee payment for medical services.
- You experience local communication problems.
- You need lost document assistance.
- You require embassy or consular assistance.
- You require emergency medication, not otherwise available.
- You require emergency travel arrangements.
- You require legal services.

The Executive Assistance Program is an emergency assistance service designed to assist you with extraordinary needs. This program is not an insurance policy and does not provide medical payments; rather it is designed to work in tandem with your existing insurance and provide assurance of benefit availability.
