REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MAJOR AND MINOR
IN THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY AND ANTHROPOLOGY

All courses for the sociology or anthropology major or minor must be taken for a grade. Some off campus study courses may count toward the major or minor, but please note the requirements below for sociology and anthropology majors and minors. In all cases, if you want an off campus study course to count for the major or minor, you must get approval in writing by the department chair or a department member. You must get preliminary approval before going away; after returning, the department will give formal approval based on the coursework. Please bring back to Bowdoin all relevant coursework from any courses for which you want to receive sociology or anthropology credit.

The *major in sociology* consists of ten courses, including Sociology 101, 201, 211, and 310. One or two of the ten courses may be advanced courses from anthropology (or, if approved by the department chair, from related fields to meet the student's special interests) or off-campus study courses (with departmental approval). In all cases, at least seven of the courses counted toward the major must be Bowdoin sociology courses. Sociology 201 should be taken in the sophomore year.

The *major in anthropology* consists of nine courses, including Anthropology 101, 102, 201, 203, and 310, and one course with an area focus. Students are urged to complete Anthropology 101, 102, 201, and 203 as early as possible. One or two of the nine courses may be taken from the advanced offerings in sociology and/or, with departmental approval, from an off-campus study program. In all cases, at least seven of the courses counted toward the major must be Bowdoin anthropology courses.

The *minor in sociology* consists of five sociology courses, including Sociology 101, 201, and 211 and two other sociology courses. One of the elective courses may be from off-campus study.

The *minor in anthropology* consists of five anthropology courses, including Anthropology 101 and 203, either 102 or 201, and an area study course. One of the elective courses may be from off-campus study.

For the anthropology major or minor program, one semester of independent study may be counted. For the sociology major program, two semesters of independent study may be counted, while for the minor program one semester may be counted.
