#### About the Show:

In this art exhibition of his printed work, Richard Tuttle experiments with the printmaking process, material, and color.

### What is a print?

A print is when you put ink on one surface and transfer the image to another surface. This process is a lot like finger-painting or stamping. In both, you transfer an image (a fingerprint or stamp) onto paper, using ink.


### How does the scavenger hunt work?


Do you notice the piece of metal in front of this print? This object is made of copper and is known as a <u>plate</u>. A <u>plate</u> is carved with a design, coated in ink, and then pressed against the paper in order to transfer the image.

The paper had two colors on it before Tuttle printed a design with this plate.

Look closely. What color ink do you think he used with this plate?

[Hint: look at the top layer!]

Notice how parts of the paper in this piece are pushed in—these are called plate marks.

When the <u>plate</u> is pressed against the paper, the edges leave <u>plate marks</u>.

Choose one print. How many <u>plate marks</u> can you find?




Watch your feet!


