Final Thesis due to readers: Follow the format of the thesis due to the library and include Abstract, Acknowledgements, Table of Content, List of Figures, List of Tables, etc. (See the Library Webpage for Honors Guidelines and Tips) The deadline is firm. Failure to submit the thesis on time to your advisors and readers will result in honors not being awarded. In extreme situations, such as a death in the family or individual health concerns verified by the Dean of Students/Health Center, the student may petition the Program Director for an extension. The Director will consult the program members for approval of the petition.
