The **Schiller Coastal Studies Center** (SCSC) facilitates teaching and research across a range of scientific disciplines. Access to the ocean enriches our hands-on research approach, and our natural laboratory includes walking access to miles of coastal habitat (rocky intertidal, cobble beach, soft sediment, and subtidal eelgrass), as well as water access to exposed rocky environments and the Kennebec and New Meadows estuaries.

Bowdoin's connection to this facility began with a deeded gift from the family of Irma and William H. Thalheimer '27 and was enhanced over the years by gifts from L.L. Bean Chairman Leon Gorman '56, H'83 and Lisa Gorman and by Geoffrey C. Rusack '78, P'13 and Alison Wrigley Rusack P'13, along with support from the National Science Foundation. A new phase of development was launched in 2017 with a generous gift from from Phil Schiller P'17 and Kim Gassett-Schiller P'17, and the center is renamed the Schiller Coastal Studies Center in their honor.
