The Latin text quoted at left has introduced Bowdoin's Commencement Program since August 21, 1822. The names of the 24 graduates of the Class of 1822 were, for the most part, also translated into Latin for the program. In the early years of the College, each graduating senior was required to deliver a Commencement "part," an oration on ancient or modern topics, which was frequently given in one of the classical languages, Latin, Greek, or Hebrew. The final Latin oration was given in 1893, but the tradition of Latin survives in the language used to dedicate the Commencement Exercises and to confer the bachelor of arts degree. The translation below was provided by Barbara Weiden Boyd, Henry Winkley Professor of Latin and Greek.

May it be good, felicitous, and well-omened:*
To John Baldacci, esteemed Governor;
to the Representatives and Senators
who personally preside over the arts and letters for
the State of Maine;
and to the honorable and respected Trustees of
Bowdoin College;
to Barry Mills, distinguished President;
to the entire academic senate; to the venerable
religious leaders;
in short, to all patrons of the human race everywhere,
the young people hereby initiated into the arts
and letters
most humbly dedicate these exercises.

Held in a gathering of Bowdoin College, in
Brunswick, in the State of Maine,
on the tenth day before the Kalends of June, in the
2009th year of our well-being
and in the 233rd year of the authority of the
United States of America.

* An ancient Roman formula used at the outset of a ritual to ensure its success.

This ancient formula is used by the President
in conferring degrees:

Candidati pro gradu baccalaureali, assurgite.

HONORANDS OF THE 2009 COMMENCEMENT

EDWARD F. ALBEE, *Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.)*

Edward Albee established himself as one of America's premier playwrights more than a half-century ago. Over the course of his extraordinary career he received three Pulitzer Prizes for drama—for *A Delicate Balance* (1966; 1996 Tony Award), *Seascape* (1974), and *Three Tall Women* (1991). Other plays include *The Zoo Story* (his first, 1958), *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?* (1961–62; 1963 Tony Award), and *The Goat or, Who Is Sylvia?* (2000; 2002 Tony Award). He is a member of the Dramatists Guild Council and the president of the Edward F. Albee Foundation. Among his many honors are a special Tony Award for Lifetime Achievement (2005), the Gold Medal in Drama from the American Academy and Institute of Arts and Letters (1980), Kennedy Center Honors (1996), and the National Medal of Arts (1996).

STEPHEN W. HANNOCK '74, *Doctor of Fine Arts (D.F.A.)*

Renowned luminist landscape painter Stephen W. Hannock attended Bowdoin and Smith colleges, and graduated from Hampshire College. While at Smith he studied with Leonard Baskin. From his early work, Hannock demonstrated a keen appreciation for the quality of light and for the limitations of conventional materials and methods for capturing it. His technique of sandpaper-polishing the surfaces of paintings gives a trademark luminous quality to his landscapes. His design of visual effects for the 1998 film *What Dreams May Come* won an Academy Award. He recently created a work for the Bowdoin College Museum of Art—*Oxbow for Bowdoin College; Flooded River for Leonard Baskin and David P. Becker (Mass MoCA #84)*—that was the centerpiece of the only solo exhibition at the rededication of the renovated Museum.

OLUFUNMILAYO OLOPADE, *Doctor of Science (Sc.D.)*

Olufunmilayo Olopade, Walter L. Palmer Distinguished Service Professor of Medicine and Human Genetics at the University of Chicago, epitomizes the “bench to bedside” philosophy in her application of scientific discoveries to clinical medicine and has seamlessly parlayed her findings into clinical applications. She has national and international recognition as a physician scientist. As a hematologist/oncologist, she specializes in cancer risk assessment, prevention, early detection, and treatment of aggressive breast cancer that disproportionately affects young women. Olopade grew up in Nigeria and earned her M.D. at the University of Ibadan. She completed her internship and residency at Chicago's Cook County Hospital and was a postdoctoral fellow at the University of Chicago. She is a recipient of the James S. McDonnell Foundation Scholar award, the Doris Duke Distinguished Clinical Scientist award, and a 2005 MacArthur Fellowship “genius” grant.

KENNETH ROTH, *Doctor of Laws (LL.D.)*

Kenneth Roth is the executive director of Human Rights Watch, which is the largest U.S.-based human rights organization and monitors developments in more than eighty countries worldwide. Prior to joining Human Rights Watch in 1987, Roth served as a federal prosecutor in the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York and for the Iran-Contra investigation in Washington. He began working on human rights after the declaration of martial law in Poland in 1981, and soon also became deeply engaged in fighting military repression in Haiti. A graduate of Yale Law School and Brown University, Roth has conducted numerous human rights investigations and missions around the world. He has testified frequently before the U.S. Congress and international bodies, and has written extensively on human rights abuses, international justice, and war crimes.

SHEILA WATT-CLOUTIER, *Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.)*

Environmentalist Sheila Watt-Cloutier has been a powerful voice in the international discussion of global climate change, human rights, and political and economic policies. Born in Kuujjuag, Nunavik, she is the past chair of Inuit Circumpolar Council (ICC), the organization that represents internationally the 155,000 Inuit of Canada, Greenland, Alaska, and Chukotka in the far east of Russia. She represented a coalition of northern indigenous Peoples in the global negotiations that led to the 2001 Stockholm Convention banning the generation and use of persistent organic pollutants that contaminate the arctic food web. She contributed markedly to ICC Canada's Institution-Building for Northern Russian Indigenous People's Project, and has worked through the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights to defend Inuit human rights against the impacts of climate change.

HONORS IN MAJOR SUBJECTS

The departments of Art, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, English, Geology, History, Mathematics, Music, Psychology, Romance Languages, and Sociology and Anthropology, and the Biochemistry, Environmental Studies, Gender and Women's Studies, Latin American Studies, and Neuroscience programs award only one level of departmental honors. ACADEMIC APPAREL

The formal academic attire that distinguishes faculty and graduates at academic ceremonies is a symbol at once vertical and horizontal. It stretches back into history, to the roots of academic institutions, while at the same time it forms a bond of union among contemporary academic scholars.

The gown, cap, and hood, which would certainly seem quaint today if worn on our city streets, were originally the ordinary apparel of our medieval ancestors. The gowns varied in elegance according to the rank and wealth of the owners, and the hood had the practical function of being pulled over the head for warmth. Many of the medieval universities had strict rules on the subject; at Oxford, for example, the master of arts had to swear that he owned the dress prescribed for his degree and that he would wear it on all proper occasions. Undergraduates were required to wear their gowns whenever they appeared in the public street. After the sixteenth century in Europe different styles prevailed, but the older style was retained for certain legal, official, clerical, and, especially, academic uses.

In America the gown has been used to some extent since colonial times. It was only in the late nineteenth century, however, that widespread interest—sparked perhaps by the observance in 1886 of the 250th anniversary of the founding of Harvard—brought about several developments. In 1887 an enterprising member of the graduating class of Williams College designed academic gowns for the graduates to wear at the Commencement ceremony. The garb was significant and dignified; it was both traditional and democratic; it answered a need, and it quickly became popular. In 1895 an intercollegiate code, standardizing

the design and the color of each part of the academic regalia, was accepted by nearly all American colleges and universities.

The gown is usually black, and the cut of the sleeves differs for bachelors, masters, and doctors. In addition, the doctor's gown has panels of velvet (usually black) down the front and on the sleeves.

The cap is generally black, with a tassel, which is either black or the color of the field of study; a doctor's may be gold. The most common style of cap is the Oxford "mortar board," with a square flat top, but some variations are permitted.

The hood is the most distinctive part of the costume. It is made of black and trimmed with velvet. Both the length of the hood and the width of the trim vary with the level of the degree, the doctor's being the longest and having the widest velvet border. The color of the velvet indicates the field of study in which the degree is earned: for example, white for arts and letters (bachelor of arts), dark blue for philosophy, brown for fine arts, golden yellow for science, scarlet for theology. The lining of the hood is the color and style of the university that confers the degree; these are all specified in the standard code of the American Council on Education. Bowdoin College's lining is white and green to symbolize the Bowdoin pines.

Whatever the degree or university, those who don the gown and hood symbolically take their places in the long procession of scholars who have pursued truth and learning and passed it on to others. The consciousness of that fellowship is at once a reward for past efforts and an inspiration for the future.
