MAINE BASED ENVIRONMENTAL FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION- Summer 2025

Deadline: Tuesday, February 4, 2025 at 12:00 NOON

The Environmental Studies Maine Based summer fellowships provide students with a 10-week funded placement in a local non-profit with the opportunity to address community issues while completing a project for the organization. All placements are at 40 hours per week from early June to mid-August. (Please note that during this time, students may not be employed by the College in any other position.)

The application includes a fellowship proposal and a resume (with two references) to be uploaded in one PDF document.

Fellowship Proposal

Applications will be considered if a candidate has an internship offer already or if a candidate has solid ideas for their summer project. A student does not need to have all the details worked out at the time of submission.

The proposal should be 1–2-pages single-spaced and address the following: (1) a description of the experience you hope to gain in the environmental field through the fellowship; (2) possible community organizations you hope to work for in the fellowship placement. We will be post the names of organizations who have expressed an interest in hosting a fellow on the Maine-based fellowship website. If you have been in touch with any of these organizations, please indicate which organization(s), what communication you have had, and what interests you about these organizations. Note, that students may explore placements outside of this list; (3) type of projects you would be interested in exploring as part of your fellowship; (4) how the fellowship builds upon environmental studies classes you have taken.

Resume

At the end of your resume please provide the best phone number for you and TWO references: name, position, telephone number, and email. One reference must be a Bowdoin faculty member. If we select you for a fellowship, please know that organizations may use the information you provide to contact you and your references as part of the placement process. Ask your references in advance if you can list them on your application and provide references with the link to the fellowship application.
