





How much enjoyment do you get out of taking care of your child/children yourself?





How would you compare the <u>quality of</u> child care that <u>you provided</u> compared to the average day care, nanny, or babysitter?







How important are family values to you?




Market Employment is work for compensation. It includes working for someone else and selfemployment.


If you work for money, how satisfied are you with your work? If you do not now work, how satisfied do you think you would be from working?




How important to your parent(s) or guardian(s) is / was their job?
