The Latin text quoted on the preceding page has introduced Bowdoin's Commencement Program since August 21, 1822. The names of the twenty-four graduates of the Class of 1822 were, for the most part, also translated into Latin for the program. In the early years of the College, each graduating senior was required to deliver a Commencement "part," an oration on ancient or modern topics, which was frequently given in one of the classical languages, Latin, Greek, or Hebrew. The final Latin oration was given in 1893, but the tradition of Latin survives in the language used to dedicate the Commencement Exercises. The translation below was provided by Associate Professor of Classics and Chair of the Department of Classics Jennifer Kosak.

May it be good, felicitous, and well-omened:*

To Janet Mills, esteemed Governor;
to the Representatives and Senators
who personally preside over the arts and letters for
the State of Maine;
and to the honorable and respected Trustees of
Bowdoin College;
to Safa Zaki, distinguished President;
to the entire academic senate; to the venerable
religious leaders;
in short, to all patrons of the human race everywhere,
the young people hereby initiated into the arts
and letters
most humbly dedicate these exercises.

Held in a gathering of Bowdoin College, in
Brunswick, in the State of Maine,
on the tenth day before the Kalends of June, in the
2026th year of our well-being
and in the 250th year of the authority of the United
States of America.

* An ancient Roman formula used at the outset of a ritual to ensure its success.

DEGREES

The president follows an ancient formula, translated here from the original Latin, in conferring degrees:

Candidates for the Baccalaureate degrees will rise.

(To the Chair of the Board of Trustees)

Honored colleague, these young people whom the faculty deem worthy of the first degree in arts, I now present to you, so that, if you so direct, I may admit them to that degree.

Is this your will? (It is.)

(To the Candidates)

By virtue of the authority vested in me, I now admit you to the first degree in arts and do grant and confer upon you all the rights, privileges, honors, and dignities pertaining to that degree.

Being so admitted, you may now receive these diplomas.

Ancient formula in Latin:

Candidati pro gradu baccalaureali, assurgite.

Collega honorande, hosce iuvenes, quos professores censent idoneos primum ad gradum in artibus, nunc tibi offero, ut a te instructus, eos ad gradum istum admittam.

Placetne? (Placet.)

Pro auctoritate mihi commissa, admitto vos ad primum gradum in artibus, et dono et concedo omnia iura, privilegia, honores atque dignitates, ad gradum istum pertinentia.

In cuius testimonium hasce membranas litteris scriptas accipite.

NOTE: The Baccalaureate degrees are awarded individually, and the graduating class requests that there be no applause until the last degree is conferred.

HONORANDS OF THE 2026 COMMENCEMENT

SHARON DALEY, *Doctor of Humane Letters (LHD)*

Sharon Daley, a registered nurse and board vice president of The Beacon Project, an Islesboro eldercare nonprofit that runs the assisted living home Boardman Cottage, has dedicated her career to delivering health care to those without easy access and strengthening coastal and island communities through education and connection.

For twenty-two years, Daley served as the Maine Seacoast Mission's director of island health and nurse on the *Sunbeam*, the mission's seventy-four-foot boat, until her retirement in December 2022. Maine Seacoast Mission is a long-standing nonprofit that supports the state's remote coastal communities and islands by focusing on health care, youth education, fighting food insecurity, improving housing, and fostering community connections.

Daley came aboard the *Sunbeam* in 2000 to launch the Mission's telemedicine program with a goal of connecting the islands to mainland hospitals and clinics. Upon the discovery that many people in those service areas were homebound and could not easily obtain blood work, and as other needs were uncovered, the program and Daley's role began and continued to evolve.

Over the years, Daley has focused on all aspects of living and aging on an island. Part of her work was founding and facilitating the Island Eldercare Network, which brings together islanders and health care providers who work with island elders to share resources, connect, and continue to help those who wish to live on an island in their later years. Daley also recognized a need to connect island residents with mental health resources, contacting local providers and facilitating telemedicine visits on the *Sunbeam*. As people struggled with addiction, Daley was instrumental in setting up Narcan stations and connecting those in need to AA meetings, and when the COVID-19 pandemic struck, she worked with the Maine Center for Disease Control to ensure islanders had access to vaccinations.

Daley graduated from what was then the Barnes Hospital School of Nursing in St. Louis, Missouri. Prior to joining the Mission, Daley worked in a number of nursing roles, including in pediatrics at Massachusetts General Hospital and Boston Children's Hospital, and in home health care and rehabilitative and hospice nursing in Boston and rural Maine.

EVAN GERSHKOVICH, *Doctor of Humane Letters (LHD)*

Evan Gershkovich is a journalist at *The Wall Street Journal* and a member of the Class of 2014. Gershkovich, who had been living and working in Russia for six years, most recently working out of the *WSJ*'s Moscow bureau, was imprisoned in Russia for more than a year after he was detained by Russia's Federal Security Service in March 2023 on unsubstantiated charges of espionage.

This marked the first time since the Cold War that a journalist working for an American news outlet had been arrested on charges of spying. In July 2024, despite declarations by the White House and *WSJ* that he was not involved in espionage and was being "wrongfully detained," Gershkovich was sentenced to sixteen years in prison. He was released on August 1, 2024, as part of a prisoner exchange, which some say had been the Russian government's end goal all along.

Four months after his release from captivity, Gershkovich and three of his *WSJ* colleagues published an article that shined a spotlight on the Department for Counterintelligence Operations, known as DKRO, the secretive Kremlin agency that arrested him and reported to be "at the very core of Putin's wartime regime."

Gershkovich's memoir, *This Cursed Beautiful Land: A Russian-American Story*, chronicling his time in prison and Russia's move toward autocracy, is to be published by Crown Publishing, an imprint of Penguin Random House, and will be available September 29, 2026.

A philosophy major and English minor at Bowdoin, Gershkovich worked for *The New York Times* from 2016 to 2017, *The Moscow Times* from 2017 to 2020, and *Agence France-Presse* from 2020 to 2022 before moving to the *WSJ* in January 2022. In 2024, Gershkovich was awarded the National Press Foundation's Chairman's Citation, which recognizes individuals whose accomplishments fall outside the traditional categories of excellence but who nevertheless have a profound impact on journalism, and the Radio Television Digital News Association Foundation's First Amendment Award, honoring those who "practice, promote, and defend journalism." He was also named one of *TIME*'s "100 Most Influential People," appearing on the magazine's March 25, 2024, cover.

CECILIA ELENA ROUSE, *Doctor of Humane Letters (LHD)*

Cecilia Elena Rouse is the president of the Brookings Institution. From 2021 to 2023, she served as chair of the Council of Economic Advisers (CEA). Confirmed with ninety-five votes in the US Senate, she served as CEA chair while on public service leave from Princeton University, where she joined the faculty in 1992. While at Princeton, she also served as dean of the Princeton School of Public and International Affairs from 2012 to 2021. She is the University's Katzman-Ernst Professor in Economics and Education and a professor of economics and public affairs.

A labor economist with a focus on the economics of education, Rouse is the founding director of the Princeton Education Research Section and a member of the American Philosophical Society, the National Academy of Education, and the National Academy of Sciences. She served as senior editor of *The Future of Children*, a policy journal published by Princeton and the Brookings Institution, coeditor of the *Journal of Labor Economics*, and on the editorial boards of the *American Economic Journal: Economic Policy* and other journals.

She served as a member of the Council of Economic Advisers from 2009 to 2011 and as special assistant to the president at the National Economic Council from 1998 to 1999. Rouse earned both her doctoral degree in economics and her bachelor's degree from Harvard University.

ACADEMIC APPAREL

The formal academic attire that distinguishes faculty and graduates at academic ceremonies is a symbol at once vertical and horizontal. It stretches back into history, to the roots of academic institutions, while at the same time it forms a bond of union among contemporary academic scholars.

The gown, cap, and hood, which would certainly seem quaint today if worn on our city streets, were originally the ordinary apparel of our medieval ancestors. The gowns varied in elegance according to the rank and wealth of the owners, and the hood had the practical function of being pulled over the head for warmth. Many of the medieval universities had strict rules on the subject; at Oxford, for example, the master of arts had to swear that he owned the dress prescribed for his degree and that he would wear it on all proper occasions. Undergraduates were required to wear their gowns whenever they appeared in the public street. After the sixteenth century in Europe different styles prevailed, but the older style was retained for certain legal, official, clerical, and, especially, academic uses.

In America the gown has been used to some extent since colonial times. It was only in the late nineteenth century, however, that widespread interest—sparked perhaps by the observance in 1886 of the 250th anniversary of the founding of Harvard—brought about several developments. In 1887 an enterprising member of the graduating class of Williams College designed academic gowns for the graduates to wear at the Commencement ceremony. The garb was significant and dignified; it was both traditional and democratic; it answered a need, and it quickly became popular. In 1895 an intercollegiate code, standardizing

the design and the color of each part of the academic regalia, was accepted by nearly all American colleges and universities.

The gown is usually black, and the cut of the sleeves differs for bachelors, masters, and doctors. In addition, the doctor's gown has panels of velvet (usually black) down the front and on the sleeves.

The cap is generally black, with a tassel, which is either black or the color of the field of study; a doctor's may be gold. The most common style of cap is the Oxford "mortar board," with a square flat top, but some variations are permitted.

The hood is the most distinctive part of the costume. It is made of black and trimmed with velvet. Both the length of the hood and the width of the trim vary with the level of the degree, the doctor's being the longest and having the widest velvet border. The color of the velvet indicates the field of study in which the degree is earned: for example, white for arts and letters (bachelor of arts), dark blue for philosophy, brown for fine arts, golden yellow for science, scarlet for theology. The lining of the hood is the color and style of the university that confers the degree; these are all specified in the standard code of the American Council on Education. Bowdoin College's lining is white and green to symbolize the Bowdoin pines.

Whatever the degree or university, those who don the gown and hood symbolically take their places in the long procession of scholars who have pursued truth and learning and passed it on to others. The consciousness of that fellowship is at once a reward for past efforts and an inspiration for the future.
