The Latin text quoted on the preceding page has introduced Bowdoin's Commencement Program since August 21, 1822. The names of the twenty-four graduates of the Class of 1822 were, for the most part, also translated into Latin for the program. In the early years of the College, each graduating senior was required to deliver a Commencement "part," an oration on ancient or modern topics, which was frequently given in one of the classical languages, Latin, Greek, or Hebrew. The final Latin oration was given in 1893, but the tradition of Latin survives in the language used to dedicate the Commencement Exercises and to confer the bachelor of arts degree. The translation below was provided by Associate Professor of Classics and Chair of the Department of Classics Jennifer B. Clarke Kosak.

May it be good, felicitous, and well-omened:*

To Janet Mills, esteemed Governor;

to the Representatives and Senators

who personally preside over the arts and letters for the State of Maine;

and to the honorable and respected Trustees of Bowdoin College;

to Safa Zaki, distinguished President;

to the entire academic senate; to the venerable religious leaders;

in short, to all patrons of the human race everywhere,

the young people hereby initiated into the arts and letters

most humbly dedicate these exercises.

Held in a gathering of Bowdoin College, in Brunswick, in the State of Maine,

on the ninth day before the Kalends of June, in the 2025th year of our well-being

and in the 249th year of the authority of the United States of America.

* An ancient Roman formula used at the outset of a ritual to ensure its success.

DEGREES

The president uses an ancient formula, translated here from the original Latin, in conferring degrees:

Candidates for the Baccalaureate degrees will rise.

(To the Chair of the Board of Trustees)

Honored colleague, these young people whom the faculty deem worthy of the first degree in arts, I now present to you, so that, if you so direct, I may admit them to that degree.

Is this your will? (It is.)

(To the Candidates)

By virtue of the authority vested in me, I now admit you to the first degree in arts and do grant and confer upon you all the rights, privileges, honors, and dignities pertaining to that degree.

Being so admitted, you may now receive these diplomas.

Ancient formula in Latin:

Candidati pro gradu baccalaureali, assurgite.

Collega honorande, hosce iuvenes, quos professores censent idoneos primum ad gradum in artibus, nunc tibi offero, ut a te instructus, eos ad gradum istum admittam.

Placetne? (Placet.)

Pro auctoritate mihi commissa, admitto vos ad primum gradum in artibus, et dono et concedo omnia iura, privilegia, honores atque dignitates, ad gradum istum pertinentia.

In cuius testimonium hasce membranas litteris scriptas accipite.

NOTE: The Baccalaureate degrees are awarded individually, and the graduating class requests that there be no applause until the last degree is conferred.

HONORANDS OF THE 2025 COMMENCEMENT

MICHELE CYR, *Doctor of Humane Letters (LHD)*

Michele Cyr, a member of the Class of 1976 and former chair of the Bowdoin College Board of Trustees (2016–2019), is senior associate dean for academic affairs, biology, and medicine at Brown University's Warren Alpert Medical School. Cyr oversees the offices of biomedical faculty administration, faculty development, women in medicine and science, continuing medical education, and graduate medical education. At Brown, she has served in multiple leadership positions, including director of the Division of General Internal Medicine, program director for the General Internal Medicine Residency Program, leadership director for the Brown University/Women's and Infants Hospital National Center of Excellence in Women's Health, associate dean of medicine for graduate medical education, associate dean of medicine for women in medicine, co-chair of the University's Sexual Assault Task Force, chair of the Title IX Oversight Committee, and co-chair of Brown's COVID-19 Testing Working Group. She has been the principal investigator for Department of Health and Human Services grants for primary care residency training and is currently co-principal investigator for two grants from the Warren Alpert Foundation to establish school-based student health clinics coupled with pathways to medicine programming in public schools in Central Falls, RI. An advocate for faculty, diversity, mentorship, and advancing women in medicine and science, Cyr is the recipient of dozens of honors and awards, including election to Master of the American College of Physicians. She has published numerous articles, chapters, and books, including coauthoring *The Complete Book of Menopause: Every Woman's Guide to Good Health* and *The New Truth About Menopause: Straight Talk About Treatment Choices from Two Leading Women Doctors*.

A nationally recognized expert in women's health, she served as the co-principal investigator for the federally funded Women's Health Initiative vanguard site in RI. An art and biochemistry double major at Bowdoin, Cyr graduated *magna cum laude* and Phi Beta Kappa and went on to Dartmouth Medical School, graduating with honors in 1979 before returning to Maine for her internal medicine residency at Maine Medical Center in Portland. Elected to the Board of Trustees in 2000, in addition to serving as chair she has served on the Executive Committee, as vice chair of the board, and as chair of the Committee on Trustees and the Academic Affairs Committee. She has also served as a member of the Facilities and Properties, Admissions and Financial Aid, Information Technology, President's Visiting, and two Presidential Search committees, as well as on the Special Committee on Multicultural Affairs, Museum of Art Executive Advisory Council, and Subcommittee on Honors. Cyr has served as a BCAN advisor, a BASIC representative, and as a member of the Reunion Gift and Leadership Gift Committees for her class. In 1997, Cyr received Bowdoin's Distinguished Educator Award.

JEREMY FREY, *Doctor of Fine Arts (DFA)*

Jeremy Frey, one of the foremost Passamaquoddy craftspeople of his generation, descends from six generations of esteemed Indigenous basket weavers. Born and raised in the Passamaquoddy Indian Township Reservation in Maine, Frey learned traditional Wabanaki methods from his mother and by apprenticing at the Maine Indian Basketmakers Alliance. Woven from natural materials that the artist himself forages, such as sweetgrass and wood from black ash trees, Frey's vessels are characterized by subtle forms, delicately layered colors, and elaborate weaves. Building on and experimenting with the material histories of Wabanaki basketry, his work is also in dialogue with contemporary sculpture's emphasis on materiality, form, and variation within repetition. To create his basket relief prints, Frey has developed a novel form of flat weaving that can be run repeatedly through a printing press, preserving and sharing his techniques without impacting the stock of his rare materials. Basketry represents a core mode of cultural expression for Passamaquoddy people, whose tribal nation is one of five that form the Wabanaki Confederacy, along with the Penobscot, Mi'kmaq, Maliseet, and Abenaki. Frey is committed to asserting the presence of Indigenous people in the past, present, and future. His baskets have revitalized this artform and created new possibilities for emerging Native American artists to innovate their craft. The first solo show of Frey's work was held at Karma Gallery in New York in 2023. His first institutional solo exhibition, *Jeremy Frey: Woven*, which debuted in 2024 at the Portland Museum of Art, was on view at the Art Institute of Chicago through February 2025. In June 2025, *Woven* will travel to the Bruce Museum in Greenwich, Connecticut. As a 2024 finalist for the Loewe Foundation Craft Prize, Frey was included in *The Celebration of Craft*, a group exhibition at the Palais de Tokyo. Other recent group exhibitions include Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York (2024); Baltimore Museum of Art (2024); North Carolina Museum of Art, Raleigh (2024); Renwick Gallery of the Smithsonian Museum of American Art, Washington, DC (2022); and deCordova Sculpture Park and Museum, Lincoln, Massachusetts (2022). He is the first two-time winner of Best of Show at the Heard Museum Indian Guild Fair and Market in Phoenix, Arizona. Frey's work is held in the public collections of the Art Institute of Chicago, Illinois; Bowdoin College Museum of Art; Denver Art Museum, Colorado; Farnsworth Art Museum, Rockland, Maine; Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York; Portland Museum of Art, Maine; Smithsonian American Art Museum, Washington, DC; University of Delaware Special Collections & Museums; and Virginia Museum of Fine Art, Richmond, among others.

ACADEMIC APPAREL

The formal academic attire that distinguishes faculty and graduates at academic ceremonies is a symbol at once vertical and horizontal. It stretches back into history, to the roots of academic institutions, while at the same time it forms a bond of union among contemporary academic scholars.

The gown, cap, and hood, which would certainly seem quaint today if worn on our city streets, were originally the ordinary apparel of our medieval ancestors. The gowns varied in elegance according to the rank and wealth of the owners, and the hood had the practical function of being pulled over the head for warmth. Many of the medieval universities had strict rules on the subject; at Oxford, for example, the master of arts had to swear that he owned the dress prescribed for his degree and that he would wear it on all proper occasions. Undergraduates were required to wear their gowns whenever they appeared in the public street. After the sixteenth century in Europe different styles prevailed, but the older style was retained for certain legal, official, clerical, and, especially, academic uses.

In America the gown has been used to some extent since colonial times. It was only in the late nineteenth century, however, that widespread interest—sparked perhaps by the observance in 1886 of the 250th anniversary of the founding of Harvard—brought about several developments. In 1887 an enterprising member of the graduating class of Williams College designed academic gowns for the graduates to wear at the Commencement ceremony. The garb was significant and dignified; it was both traditional and democratic; it answered a need, and it quickly became popular. In 1895 an intercollegiate code, standardizing

the design and the color of each part of the academic regalia, was accepted by nearly all American colleges and universities.

The gown is usually black, and the cut of the sleeves differs for bachelors, masters, and doctors. In addition, the doctor's gown has panels of velvet (usually black) down the front and on the sleeves.

The cap is generally black, with a tassel, which is either black or the color of the field of study; a doctor's may be gold. The most common style of cap is the Oxford "mortar board," with a square flat top, but some variations are permitted.

The hood is the most distinctive part of the costume. It is made of black and trimmed with velvet. Both the length of the hood and the width of the trim vary with the level of the degree, the doctor's being the longest and having the widest velvet border. The color of the velvet indicates the field of study in which the degree is earned: for example, white for arts and letters (bachelor of arts), dark blue for philosophy, brown for fine arts, golden yellow for science, scarlet for theology. The lining of the hood is the color and style of the university that confers the degree; these are all specified in the standard code of the American Council on Education. Bowdoin College's lining is white and green to symbolize the Bowdoin pines.

Whatever the degree or university, those who don the gown and hood symbolically take their places in the long procession of scholars who have pursued truth and learning and passed it on to others. The consciousness of that fellowship is at once a reward for past efforts and an inspiration for the future.
