Application for Obtaining Credit for International Examinations Including: A-Levels/GCE, French Baccalaureate, Swiss Maturité, and German Abitur

Obtaining prematriculation credit for international examinations typically taken by foreign students or American students schooled in another country is subject to the same rules as other types of prematriculation credit. First, a maximum of four pre-matriculation credits may be applied toward the Bowdoin degree from the following sources: Advanced Placement Program, International Baccalaureate Program, International Examinations and college credits from other institutions. Second, International Examinations may not be used to satisfy distribution or division requirements. Third, examinations must cover a subject area that falls within the realm of "liberal arts." Exams covering accounting or business, for example, would not be considered for credit.

The following general requirements for credit apply to these specific examinations:

GCE A-Levels: A grade of "B" or above must be earned for each subject exam.

GCE O-Levels: No credit will be awarded for the GCE O-levels.

French Baccalaureate: The Diplome du Baccalaureat General must reflect scores of at least 15 on each subject exam.

German Abitur: Scores between 10-15 (Gut-Sehr gut) must be earned on each written exam. No credit will be awarded for oral exams.

Additional requirements are established by each academic department and will be noted below. Final approval for credit is at the discretion of each Bowdoin department and additional materials may be required.
