This letter formally invites you to attend by completing the online registration form at bowdoin.edu/reunion, where you can also find the College's latest COVID protocols. (Note: this is the first time that registration will be done completely on-line.) Your reunion committee remains optimistic and hopes the entire class will SAY YES to this once-in-a-lifetime event. For our class, it perhaps is more special because of the obstacles we've faced to make this happen over the past two years.

Key Planning Information:

- Our Reunion headquarters will be at Ladd House (formally Zeta Psi), the two dorms directly behind Ladd (Osher and West), and the lawn area between these buildings. This combined area will be open to all three Reunion classes throughout the weekend. However, your first stop on campus should be to check in at Moulton Union.
- The basic Reunion fee is \$50 per person! Quite a bargain, given it covers on-campus (dormitory) lodging, meals, and beverages throughout the weekend, a Harpswell Sound/Casco Bay Cruise, weekend entertainment, and Reunion regalia.
- If on-campus housing is not your "cup of tea", you can opt to stay off-campus at personal expense. Blocks of rooms have been reserved at the Comfort Inn (207-729-1129), the Brunswick Hotel and Tavern (207-837-6565), the Fairfield Inn (207-721-0300), and the Hilton Inn Freeport (207-869-3017). Make sure you mention "Bowdoin 50th Reunion" when making reservations at these locations. Alternatively, you can check Bowdoin.edu/about/campus-location/visitor-resources/index.html for other options. Whatever you decide, we urge you to ACT SOON since rooms in the area fill quickly during Reunion Weekend.
- Dress for the weekend is casual for all events including the Saturday Memorial Service, class photo, and the Saturday evening lobster bake.
