

Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Stations are available for the Bowdoin College community and campus visitors in the Russwurm Parking lot and the parking lot near the Roux Center for the Environment. The chargers are free for the first four hours, but cost \$3 per hour after that.

Charger users must enable Apple Pay on their phones and download the ChargePoint app. Those who want to skip these steps can request a ChargePoint card instead but still need to provide credit card information.


